




The Path to Licensure

Our Credentials

- The Online M.Ed. in Counseling program is accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP)
- The Clinical Mental Health Counseling concentration prepares you for licensure and work as a Licensed Substance Abuse Treatment Practitioner (LSATP)
- The School Counseling concentration is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) and its curriculum adheres to the rigorous National Standards for School Counselors established by the American School Counselors Association (ASCA)



Career Outlook for Clinical Mental Health Counselors

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), this field is growing faster than most.

In 2021, there were more than 351,000 jobs associated with this counseling specialty, and the number of opportunities is expected to grow by an additional 77,500 positions (**a projected growth rate of 22%**) by 2031. Actual 2031 projection is 428,500.¹




Career Outlook for School Counselors

The BLS reports that the job rate in this field is expected to increase by at least 13% over a 10-year period, which is faster than average.

In 2016, there were 291,700 professional job opportunities, with an additional 37,000 expected by the year 2026.¹

And with school enrollments expected to rise by as much as 3% from now until 2027 (**an increase of almost 2 million students**), job opportunities for school counselors can be expected to rise, too.²

Program at a Glance

- Participate in two on-campus residencies
- Complete a 100-hour practicum* and a 600-hour internship
 - Practicum will require 100 clock hours at a school or CMHC site placement over two minimesters (an average of 8 hours per week on-site for each 7.5-week minimester), plus 1-2 hours per week synchronous class/supervision time with faculty
 - Internship requires a total of 600 hours over four minimesters (an average of 18 hours per week on-site for each 7.5-week minimester), plus 1-2 hours per week of synchronous class/supervision time with faculty)
 - As a general rule, students are not allowed to complete their practicum and internship placements at their current place of employment (for both school counseling and clinical mental health), to avoid any conflicts of interest
- Graduate in as few as three years
- Start classes in August, January or May
- Satisfy classroom requirements for most licensure exams
- Engage directly with faculty and peers through the online LMS
- Take advantage of our flexible program structure and scheduling to continue to work full time throughout the program
- Enjoy 24/7 IT support

**In addition to the hours conducted in the field site placement, students will have additional synchronous supervision and course requirements.*

- Completed bachelor's degree with a GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) preferred



- 3 letters of recommendation from professional and/or academic references

- For international applicants: proof of having successfully passed one of the following:
 - Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), with a minimum score of 100 on the internet version (or comparable, if test is not taken online)
 - International English Language Testing System (IELTS) exam, with a minimum score of 7.0

- [Personal essay](#) addressing the following:
 - As you begin to outline and compose your essay using the following guiding questions, please think about your career aspirations, past academic, professional and volunteer experience, leadership potential, collaborative skills and propensity to engage in reflective practice:
 - What has led you to become interested in becoming a ____ (Clinical Mental Health, School, Clinical Mental Health – Military & Veterans) counselor?

- Why are you interested in pursuing your counselor education at William & Mary?
- How will your graduate degree in Counseling at William & Mary help you achieve your career goals?
- What strengths would you bring to your graduate studies at William & Mary?
- What do you think would be the greatest challenge(s) for you in your graduate studies at William & Mary? How would you address the challenge(s)?
