The Online M.Ed. in Counseling From William & Mary

The William & Mary Online Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Counseling program emphasizes personal and interpersonal growth, cultural responsiveness and social justice. Through a collaborative approach to coursework and the use of interactive learning environments, the program aligns theory and practice to maximize students' impact as counselors. Whether your intention is to become a licensed professional counselor in clinical mental health or a school counselor, the CACREP-accredited Online M.Ed. in Counseling from W&M can help you get there.

Program Benefits

- Immerse yourself in <u>coursework</u> designed to help prepare you for <u>state licensure and/or certification exams</u>
- Enjoy a <u>flexible online program</u> designed to accommodate your busy schedule
- Explore diverse professional environments during required practicum and internship experiences
- Engage with instructors one-on-one and participate in experiential learning activities during two on-campus residencies
- No GRE score is required for admission

Online Program Structure

- 60 credit hours
- 17 online courses (51 credit hours)
- Practicum (3 credit hours):
 - Practicum will require 100 clock hours at a school or CMHC site placement over two minimesters (an average of 8 hours per week on-site for each 7.5-week minimester), plus 1-2 hours per week synchronous class/supervision time with faculty
- Internship (2 courses, 6 credit hours):
 - Internship requires a total of 600 hours over four minimesters (an average of 18 hours per week on-site for each 7.5-week minimester), plus 1-2 hours per week of synchronous class/supervision time with faculty
 - As a general rule, students are not allowed to complete their practicum and internship placements at their current place of employment (for both school counseling and clinical mental health), to avoid any conflicts of interest
- Can be completed in as few as 3 years
- Begin classes in January, May or August

Admissions Requirements

- Completed online application form
- Application fee: \$50*
- Completed bachelor's degree
 - GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) preferred
- Official transcripts from all prior institutions attended
- Resume detailing full employment history
- <u>Personal essay</u> (please refer to our <u>key points</u> and guiding questions when writing your essay)
- 3 letters of recommendation from professional and/or academic references
- For international applicants: proof of having successfully passed one of the following:
 - Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), with a minimum score of 100 on the internet version (or comparable, if test is not taken online)
 - International English Language Testing System (IELTS) exam, with a minimum score of 7.0

^{*}If you are a military or veterans service member, speak with an advisor about determining your eligibility for an app fee waiver.
